### Digital Week: Exploring and Mastering UMMTO Library Tools and Services

In coordination with faculty libraries, the University Library organized the Digital Week from 10 to 13 November 2025. This event brought together students, academic staff and librarians through practical workshops, lectures and presentations, offering participants the opportunity to discover the full range of digital tools and services provided by UMMTO libraries and to enhance their research, consultation and use of documentary resources.

The program covered a variety of themes, including a lecture delivered by Ms Amrar on “Open Source and Artificial Intelligence: Contributions to Scientific Communities through Libraries”, a presentation of the “Techniques de l’Ingénieur” database by the TI Group, and a session dedicated to OPU’s digital library, presented by an OPU team, highlighting its resources and methods of academic use.

The final day of the event took place at the newly opened annex of the ENS in Tamda, offering students and academic staff at that site the opportunity to learn how to effectively use the digital resources and services available

at UMMTO. The Digital Week also served as a forum for exchange among library staff, fostering coordination and harmonization of documentary practices and thereby enhancing the overall quality of services provided to users.

### Accessibility and Support: A Library Committed to All Users

On December 3, 2025, the University Library marked the International Day of Persons with specific needs, highlighting its strong commitment to inclusion and accessibility. This event provided an opportunity to showcase existing measures designed to facilitate access to



documentary resources, including braille materials, adapted computer equipment, assistive software solutions and dedicated spaces for users with specific needs.

The UMMTO Digital Library further strengthens these initiatives by facilitating access to digital resources and offering a variety of formats adapted to specific needs and diverse learning styles.

The day also marked the launch of a dedicated support scheme implemented by the University Library services, aimed at assisting visually impaired students in completing their academic work and preparing for examinations through personalized guidance and targeted support.

The program was rich and diverse, featuring lectures such as that presented by Dr Bouzerma Yamina on motivation and well-being, and that given by Dr Mekli KENZA on the impact of blue light on eyesight. The participation of two committed associations—the Union of the Blind of Tizi-Ouzou and the Association of Persons with specific needs Awiciphera—further enriched

discussions and encouraged the sharing of experiences. This event reaffirmed the University Library's commitment to accessibility, academic support and the provision of adapted resources for the benefit of all users.
